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Services Provided by Cerebral Palsy of New Jersey

Assistive Technology Services -

Offers consultations, evaluation, training, fabrication, information and referral services to help make the home, school and workplace "user-friendly" for people with disabilities. Services include help with computer access, job accommodations, activities of daily living, augmentative communication and environmental controls.

Community Education Services -

Transition planning and community integration to help high school students with disabilities prepare for the future.

Consumer Advocacy -

Works with individuals, families, volunteers, government officials and various organizations to support and promote independence for people with disabilities. Services include information and referral, direct advocacy and support for individuals and families, and self-advocacy groups.

Educational Support to Schools and Students -

We help schools educate students with disabilities. Services include: developing Individual Education Programs (IEP), curricular adaptation, functional assessments, behavior management, school-to-work programs, developing work-based learning experiences and community-based skills.



Family Support - Offers a comprehensive network of services to help families support a family member with a disability, including in-home respite care, inclusive recreational programs, and providing individual supports for community-based recreation programs.

Information and Referral - If our agency does not provide the services needed, our Information and Referral Specialist can help locate an organization or entity that does.

Personal Assistant Services - Provides assistants to people who have permanent physical disabilities so they can maintain community-based independent living, participate in job training, continue their education and/or sustain employment.

Prevention Education/Substance Abuse Awareness - We educate the public about substance abuse prevention and risk factors associated with substance abuse.

Strengthening Families - A family skills training program designed to increase resilience and reduce risk factors for substance abuse, depression, violence and aggression, delinquency, and school failure.

Real Life Choices - Provides support implementing Plans of Care, including individual support and family support. We also provide training in daily living skills and job readiness and job coaching services.

Technology Lending Center (TLC)

- The TLC is stocked with assistive technology, tools and devices TLC members can try before they buy.

Residential Services - Arranges housing options and supports which enable people with disabilities to live and fully participate in their communities. Adults occupy apartments and are employed, go to school, do community volunteer work and/or participate in other activities.



Social Security Work Incentive Planning and Assistance (NJWINS)

- A statewide collaborative effort with Epilepsy Foundation of New Jersey to help Social Security recipients become employed while making use of work incentives.
